

A New Addition to Zion Reformed Church

A committee consisting of Stephanie Kloetzer, Gabby Webb, Janette van Rooyen, Sammy Buseman, Jess Sheely, and Shelly Buseman in addition to Consistory, are excited to announce the addition of a brand new church playground — a place designed for fun, connection, and growth for the children of Zion Reformed Church and beyond!

The new playground features age-appropriate equipment for both toddler ages through teens. Inclusivity was a priority when the committee discussed the features a new structure would need. This playground will allow the children with many different abilities to play alongside with their peers, fostering a welcoming environment. The playground will be a gathering place for parents to connect — building community and support networks within the church family. It will also be valuable for the youth programs hosted such as Vacation Bible School and other functions.

Having a safe playground structure was also a key consideration to the committee. The equipment meets industry safety standards, and the surfacing materials being considered will be designed to minimize any risk of injury. The new playground will be located in the same place that the current play area is. Keeping it in this location will not interfere with the cemetery parameters, will allow for safety and easy supervision, and will provide some shade from the sun.

Consistory graciously granted funding for the new structure. It has been paid for and ordered and will arrive between the end of September/mid October. Fundraising will be done with the proceeds from Corn Fest (to be held August 10th) providing money in the hopes of purchasing swings, a spinner ride, and/or a park bench or two. Be watching for photos to be put up in the church of the new playground structure and these other items!

The goal of the committee is to make the new playground, a place where laughter echoes, friendships bloom, and the church family strengthens its bonds, creating memories that will last for years to come!
