Matthew 22:15-22 New International Version

Paying the Imperial Tax to Caesar

15 Then the Pharisees went out and laid plans to trap him in his words. 16 They sent their disciples to him along with the Herodians. "Teacher," they said, "we know that you are a man of integrity and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. You aren't swayed by others, because you pay no attention to who they are. 17 Tell us then, what is your opinion? Is it right to pay the imperial tax[a] to Caesar or not?" 18 But Jesus, knowing their evil intent, said, "You hypocrites, why are you trying to trap me? 19 Show me the coin used for paying the tax." They brought him a denarius, 20 and he asked them, "Whose image is this? And whose inscription?" 21 "Caesar's," they replied. Then he said to them, "So give back to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's." 22 When they heard this, they were amazed. So, they left him and went away.

#### Your preparation:

Read the passage several times. Highlight any words or ideas that draw your attention.

What are the key phrases or sentences that seem important for the theme or main idea of the passage?

Identify people in this passage.

Summarize your passage.

Apply the passage principles to yourself.

Some helpful information: Question of Taxes

Cross Reference: Mark 12:13-17

The Pharisees try to trap Jesus with a public question (they think) He can't answer without making enemies. They can't arrest Him yet (12:12), so they try to discredit Him. 12:13 The Pharisees and the Herodians attempt to trap Jesus in His talk.

12:14 The Pharisees' method is to flatter Jesus first. They tell Him what he actually is, but they do so to try to get Him to lower His guard so that He'll be unprepared for the question, which is whether it is lawful to pay tax to Caesar. If Jesus says "yes", He will appear to be against Israel. If He says "no", He will appear to be against Caesar.

12:15 Jesus hints at their wrong motive but then answers their question in a straightforward but profound way. He asks for a Roman denarius, which everyone has, because it is the currency of the whole empire.

12:16 Jesus asks whose image and writing is on the coin, and they answer the obvious: Caesar's.

12:17 In saying "Render to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's," Jesus is not saying that Caesar owns things that God doesn't own. He is saying that in God's providence, God has allowed some people to have prominence and authority. No one can wield political power but that God gives it to him. The evidence that God has given Caesar that power is in everyone's money pouch. Naturally, then, Caesar has his realm of God-given authority, and people under his authority should give him his due. Everyone is benefiting from the Roman Empire's protection, road system, and currency, so they should pay tax. Paul expands on this in Rom 13:1–7.
